








A large-format manuscript coloured **map of the Tloskov estate** underlaid with canvas documents the extraordinary surveying skill. In a graphic representation, it presents the division of land in Tloskov and Osečany, including all the parts lent from the dominical to the manorial millers, innkeepers and other manorial staff. At the same time, it marks the area of the forests of that time, records the scattered farmsteads of freemen, captures the ground plan of towns and villages and preserves evidence of the now defunct glassworks in Nová Ves and the salt warehouse above Žibovičtš



The first thorough measurement and mapping of the entire estate took place in Tloskov at the end of the 1820s. To carry out the plan, the then owner of the estate, Count Jáchym Pachta of Rájov, summoned the land surveyor Jan Glocksperger (1689–1771), a native of Askach, Austria, but who spent a large part of his life in Bohemia.

Glocksperger was to measure all the manorial and serf land for a reward of 3 kreutzers per korec, including the preparation of a general map of the estate.

The surveying work of the extensive Tloskov estate with the appropriate calculations and drawing took almost five years. It was not until the spring of 1732 that Glocksperger handed over the finished work to earl Pachta



Project objectives



The project presents large-format archival materials that, due to their properties, cannot be used in basic and applied research, because the technical, personnel and spatial possibilities of memory institutions for handling them and their professional processing and use in applied research have not been possible so far.

The main objective of the project is therefore to implement a proven technology for the methodological procedure of the most suitable presentation of this difficult-to-present movable cultural heritage and its identification and interpretation.

Another objective is to focus on the protection, conservation, restoration and prevention of this national movable cultural heritage for its preservation and for the improvement of the system of care for it


